



These gloves were worn by John Graham of Claverhouse, Viscount Dundee, the charismatic Jacobite leader who was mortally wounded leading his men to victory at the Battle of Killiecrankie on 27 July 1689.



Killiecrankie1689 is in favour of upgrading the A9 but is opposed to the latest refined design.



This version still makes no attempt to avoid destroying important features on the core battlefield.



The stark construction will exacerbate the severance of the battlefield in relation to key landscape characteristics.



The steep embankments will make the road more prominent, jutting out sharply from the natural downslope, ruining the landscape.



The character of the area around the Memorial Cairn, a place of remembrance, will be adversely affected.



This is a biased design that does not balance the competing needs of engineers, residents and the historic and natural environments.
